



HIC (Housing Inventory Count)

- A Housing Inventory Count (HIC) is a point-in-time inventory of projects within your CoC that provide beds and units dedicated to serving persons who are homeless.
- It is intended to provide HUD and CoCs with information about the shelter and housing capacity of homeless crisis response systems

This year's count will be on

Tuesday, February 22nd

from 5pm until 5pm the following day



HIC (Housing Inventory Count)

- Beds and units included on the HIC must be dedicated to serving homeless persons
- For the HIC, a project with dedicated beds/units is where:
 - The primary intent of the project is to serve homeless persons;
 - The project verifies homeless status as part of its eligibility determination; and
 - The actual project clients are predominantly homeless (or, for permanent housing, were homeless at entry).



Coordinator Responsibilities

- Lead efforts for your region's HIC count
- Responsible for identifying additional projects for inclusion in the HIC in their community
- Responsible for collecting HIC surveys from non-HMIS agencies and getting them to the Kansas Statewide Homeless Coalition via email to staff@kshomeless.com or mail at:



The HIC count will come from Clarity for CoC, ESG, and SSVF funded, HMIS participating projects.


Non-HMIS Participating Projects

The HIC count from projects located in the CoC without access to Clarity, will come from completed HIC surveys.



HIC Count

- Beds and units in the HIC are separated by:
 - Household Type
 - With children
 - Without children
 - With only children
 - Dedicated Inventory
 - Veteran Beds
 - Youth Beds
 - Chronic (PSH only)





Emergency Shelter

Emergency shelters have three options for availability:

Year-Round, Seasonal, & Overflow

Seasonal

Not available year-round, but on a planned basis, with set start & end dates, during an anticipated period of higher demand. For the HIC, identify only the number available for occupancy the night of the count.

Overflow

Available on an ad-hoc or temporary basis during the year in response to demand that exceeds planned bed capacity. For the HIC, identify only the number available for occupancy the night of the count.



Rapid Re-Housing

- Rapid Re-Housing projects should count current project participants who are:
 - 1. Actively enrolled in the project the night of the count
- & 2. Are in permanent housing on that night.

SSVF

SSVF projects should include their RRH programs, but not HP



Veteran Projects

In addition to SSVF RRH, the following VA projects should be included in the HIC:

SSVF EHA

Emergency Housing Assistance voucher beds should be counted, separate from RRH, as Emergency Shelter Overflow beds. Should include the total number of people served by EHA on the night of the count.

HUD VASH

Should include the total number of VASH vouchers available for use on the night of the count, regardless of whether the voucher is currently being used.

Component in GPD	HIC Project Type
Bridge Housing	Transitional Housing
Low Demand	Save Haven
Service Intensive Transitional Housing	Transitional Housing
Hospital to Housing	Transitional Housing
Clinical Treatment	Transitional Housing
Transition in Place	Permanent Housing-OPH
